

How to apply to TAFE NSW and UWS



Read the information on DegreeLink courses at TAFE NSW and at University of Western Sydney (UWS) and decide which TAFE Diploma and Degree Program you want to apply for. This information is available from TAFE and UWS international brochures and websites -

Fill in two application forms – one for TAFE NSW and the other for the University of Western Sydney (UWS). Only one set of supporting documents such as academic transcripts and IELTS report forms is required with the two applications



Return **both** application forms to TAFE International Students Centre



The ISC will assess your application and send you offers for the courses you have applied for- these include, if required, an ELICOS course at TAFE, a TAFE Diploma course and a provisional offer for a UWS degree program. An Offer pack from UWS is included with the offers. The UWS provisional offer states the credit you will receive for the TAFE Diploma and the length and approximate cost of the UWS degree course.



In order to accept these offers payment for courses must be forwarded to the ISC- this will be one semester's fee for the TAFE Diploma, the fees for the ELICOS course if applicable, and a \$2000 deposit for the UWS course. Refund conditions for this deposit are stated on the UWS Offer pack. An Acceptance form for the UWS course must also be completed and returned. If you are from a visa Assessment Level 3 or 4 country, you should only pay fees once you have received PVA approval.



When the ISC receives fee payments and Preliminary Visa Approval (PVA) approvals from you it will issue electronic Confirmation of Enrolments (eCOEs) for all your courses, and you can use these to apply for a student visa.



You enrol at TAFE NSW and commence your TAFE course.



In the last semester of your TAFE course you will receive from UWS a second offer which will state the fees payable for enrolment at UWS and provide advice on orientation and enrolment at UWS.
